


People in Atascadero agree that there is a drug problem amongst the homeless which can result in danger for students and kids being exposed to it.

Mcdonalds Manager- To sum up the interview the McDonalds manager informed us that they have had to have multiple people removed from there property and have had countless encounters with homeless individuals struggling with mental illnesses and drug abuse.

Social worker- The social worker said that the physical and mental health of the homeless has gotten worse.

### **Main Solutions**

- Having more in person and active police officers on duty and on patrol to keep our city clean and safe would help.
- Build more cost effective housing/apartments that can be afforded by minimum wage jobs.
